The earliest known tax records, dating from approximately 6,000 years B.C., are in the form of clay tablets found in the ancient city-state of Lagash in modern day lraq,"

Pecunia non olet. This frase was Vespasian's reply to his son Titus, complaining about the **urine tax** he had imposed 1rst century AD Rome.

During the Middle Ages, some European governments placed a tax on soap. It remained in effect for a very long time. Great Britain didn't repeal its soap tax until 1835.




Coincidentally the older library on record was also located in ancient Mesopotamia 2,600 B.C.

- Networking globally




