After the first training sessions

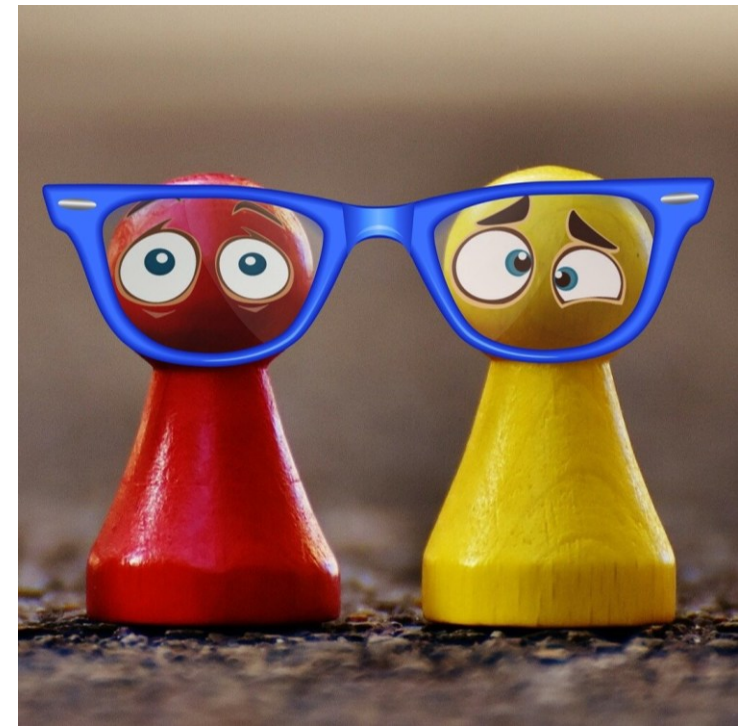
Some thoughts and insights

- The **questions asked** by participants can be challenging to answer on the spot. For example :
 - Job market statistics
 - Cost to society of a particular illness/condition
- Is the **chosen formula** (short presentation, followed by a hands-on workshop) the most appropriate?
- These workshops clearly **appeal to a new audience** that we wouldn't normally reach.
